They audit, investigate, perform analyses, issue legal decisions and report anything that the government is doing. This is one of their reports. The Secretary of the Interior should direct the Bureau of Indian Affairs to: develop and implement a system for gathering information on Indian students and the colleges they attend to help these students plan their education; encourage Indian counselors to perform duties that enhance the Indians opportunities to further their education; encourage colleges and universities without Indian counselors to see that Indian students are receiving adequate supportive services; develop regulations based on the higher education program manual and require BIA personnel to follow them; and...
