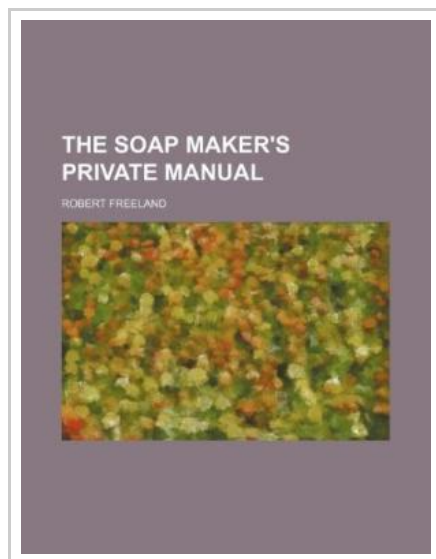

Run the melted oil into the kettle, and boil upon open steam; continue boiling, and adding the lye while the soap is in motion, until the strength of the lye is absorbed by the oil, and the soap has only a slight taste of the alkali. SAL SODA AND BRINE. Melt the sal soda on open steam, and run it into the kettle while on the boil; continue boiling for fifteen minutes, then add the prescribed quantity of brine, and boil for one hour.
